4.0 Inspection summary

An unannounced variation to registration premises inspection of Donaghadee Dental Practice took place on 3 May 2018 from 13.30 to 14.15.

This inspection was underpinned by The Health and Personal Social Services (Quality, Improvement and Regulation) (Northern Ireland) Order 2003; The Independent Health Care Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005, The Regulation and Improvement Authority (Independent Health Care) (Fees and Frequency of Inspections) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2011 and the Department of Health (DOH) Minimum Standards for Dental Care and Treatment (2011).

The inspection sought to assess an application submitted to the Regulation and Quality Improvement Authority (RQIA) for the registration of Clear Dental Larne as an Independent Hospital providing dental treatment.

No areas for improvement were identified during the inspection.

The findings of this report will provide the practice with the necessary information to assist them to fulfil their responsibilities, enhance practice and patients experience.

Information has been gathered throughout the registration process. Scrutiny of this information means that registration of the additional dental surgery at this practice is granted from an estates perspective.

5.0 How we inspect

During the inspection the inspector met with Ms Lesley Vance. A tour of the premises was also undertaken to inspect the surgery providing the additional dental chair.

The following records were examined during the inspection:

- Operational policies and procedures
- Statement of purpose
- Fire Risk Assessment
- Legionella Risk Assessment.

The findings of the inspection were provided to Ms Lesley Vance at the conclusion of the inspection.

6.0 The inspection

6.1 Inspection findings

Premises/environment

The new dental surgery had been completed to a high standard and no areas of improvement were identified.

A range of documentation in relation to the maintenance and upkeep of the premises was presented for review during this premises inspection. This documentation included inspection and test reports for various elements of the engineering services and risk assessments. A range of fire protection measures are in place for the premises. This includes a fire detection and alarm system, emergency lighting installation, portable fire-fighting equipment, structural fire separation and protection to the means of escape. A fire risk assessment had been undertaken and was available in the premises at the time of the inspection.

Records for the regular testing of the premises fire detection and alarm system, emergency lighting installation and portable fire fighting equipment were in place and available for inspection.

There are arrangements in place for routine premises management and upkeep as well as timely breakdown/repair maintenance. The premises were found to have been completed and maintained to a high standard throughout and no further requirements or recommendations have been made in respect of the premises.

The fire risk assessment was discussed at the time of the inspection and the inspector agreed to forward a copy of 'Health Technical Memorandum 86, Fire risk assessment in community healthcare premises'. This may provide a more suitable risk assessment template for the assessor to use at the next review of the fire risk assessment.

A current legionella risk assessment was in place and suitable control measures are being implemented with regards to the hot and cold water system, and the dental unit water lines at each chair.

Areas for improvement

No areas for improvement were identified during the inspection and registration of the additional dental surgery at this practice is granted from an estates perspective.
