4.0 Inspection summary

An unannounced inspection took place on 14 March 2019 from 14.30 to 14.40 hours.

This inspection was underpinned by The Health and Personal Social Services (Quality, Improvement and Regulation) (Northern Ireland) Order 2003, The Residential Care Homes Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005 and the Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety (DHSSPS) Residential Care Homes Minimum Standards (2011).

The registered person notified RQIA by letter on 6 October 2016 that they had voluntarily ceased to operate the residential home and that remaining residents had been discharged. RQIA wrote to the registered person on 8 December 2018 requesting that the Trust notify RQIA if the intention was to maintain or to cancel registration.

The registered person notified RQIA by letter on 10 January 2019 that the Trust is considering the cancelling of registration of this home. They have yet to submit an application to cancel their registration and as such, the service is subject to a minimum of two RQIA inspections per year.

This inspection was conducted to fulfil this requirement and to ensure that residents were not accommodated in the home.
