The inspection sought to assess progress with the issues raised during and since the previous inspection and to determine if the following standards have been met:

Standard 28: Fire safety

4. Methods/Process

Specific methods/processes used in this inspection include the following:

Prior to inspection the following records were analysed:

- Previous Estate's inspection report
- Statutory notifications received over the past 12 months.

During the inspection the inspector did not meet with any service users, visiting professionals or service users' representatives. The inspector met Mr Brian Watters and Ms Amanda Stevenson of the Southern HSC Trust.

The following records were examined during the inspection:

- Fire risk assessment
- Fire safety service records and in-house log books
- Electrical certificates & associated records.
- LOLER reports
- Legionella risk assessment and controls records.

5. The Inspection

5.1 Review of Requirements and Recommendations from Previous Inspection

The previous inspection of the service was an announced pharmacy inspection dated 9 February 2015. The completed QIP was returned and approved by the specialist inspector on 20 April 2015.

5.2 Review of Requirements and Recommendations from the last Estates Inspection

This is the first estates inspection at this facility since it was registered in April 2013. There is therefore no previous quality improvement plan relating to these premises and therefore no previous requirements or recommendations.

5.3 Standard 25: Premises and grounds - The premises and grounds are safe, well maintained and remain suitable for their stated purpose

Is Care Safe? (Quality of Life)

A range of documentation in relation to the maintenance and upkeep of the premises was presented for review during this Estates inspection. This documentation included inspection and test reports for various elements of the engineering services and risk assessments. This supports the delivery of safe care.

Is Care Effective? (Quality of Management)

A range of accommodation, facilities and support services is provided in the premises. This supports the delivery of effective care.

Is Care Compassionate? (Quality of Care)

The areas of the premises reviewed during this Estates inspection were well presented, clean and free from malodours. This supports the delivery of compassionate care.

Areas for Improvement

This service is to be transferred to new purpose built facilities within the next three months. In light of this imminent move there were no improvements deemed necessary as a result of this inspection.

The nature and needs of the residents are considered as part of the risk assessment processes and this is reflected in the management of the premises. This supports the delivery of effective care.

Is Care Compassionate? (Quality of Care)

There are health & safety procedures and control measures in place which support the delivery of compassionate care.

Areas for Improvement

There were no improvements deemed necessary as a result of this inspection.

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5.5 Standard 28: Fire safety - *Fire safety precautions are in place that reduce the risk of fire and protect service users, staff and visitors in the event of fire.*

Is Care Safe? (Quality of Life)

A range of fire protection measures are in place for the premises. This includes a fire detection and alarm system, emergency lighting, first aid fire-fighting equipment, structural fire separation and protection to the means of escape. This supports the delivery of safe care.

Is Care Effective? (Quality of Management)

The standard used by the registered person to determine the overall level of fire safety within the premises takes account of the interaction between the physical fire precautions, the fire hazards, the number of residents, the management policies and the availability of adequately trained staff. This standard has been referenced in the fire risk assessment. This supports the delivery of effective care.

Is Care Compassionate? (Quality of Care)

The standard used by the registered persons to determine the extent of fire safety protection measures that are appropriate for the premises recognises the need to maintain a homely, non-institutionalised environment. This supports the delivery of compassionate care.

Areas for Improvement

There were no improvements deemed necessary as a result of this inspection.
