Service users have a learning disability and may have a range of additional disabilities/conditions including profound and multiple disabilities, complex healthcare needs, dementia, autism, mental ill health, behaviours which challenge and sensory impairment.

4.0 Inspection summary

An unannounced inspection took place on 9 February 2021 from 12.30 to 13.15 hours.

The purpose of the inspection was to inspect the premises affected by variation VA011446 submitted to RQIA on 18 June 2020.

During the inspection, evidence of good practice was found in relation to management of the environment. No areas requiring improvement were identified.

This inspection was underpinned by the Day Care Setting Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2007 and the Day Care Settings Minimum Standards, 2012.

The findings of this report will provide the provider with the necessary information to assist them to fulfil their responsibilities.

This inspection resulted in no areas for improvement being identified. Findings of the inspection were discussed with the staff on duty, as part of the inspection process and can be found in the main body of the report.

6.0 The inspection

The purpose of this inspection was to assess the refurbished facilities to ensure they continue to fully comply with the current Day Care Settings minimum standards issued by the Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety.

The works undertaken consisted of a total refurbishment to the staff toilet facilities and the centralised cloak room area and service user toilet facilities. As a result additional accessible toilets have been provided along with a facility providing a shower and changing facilities, whilst maintaining the core existing toilet facilities. These have all been completed to a high standard of finish and offer a significant quality improvement to the facilities offered to both staff and service users.

Certification in relation to the electrical installation, fire detection & alarm system and the emergency lighting installation was also obtained separately to this inspection and were found to be up to date and in order. There was no change to the function or layout of the premises meaning that the current fire risk assessment remains valid.
