2.0 Profile of service

This is a nursing home with 25 beds that provides care for service users in the general nursing category. Variation application ref VA010911 is for five additional beds.

An unannounced inspection took place on 14 June 2018 from 08:50 to 09:45.

This inspection was underpinned by:

- The Nursing Homes Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005
- Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety (DHSSPS) Care Standards for Nursing Homes, April 2015

The purpose of the inspection was to inspect the proposed additional five bedrooms detailed in variation application ref VA010911. The five bedrooms are currently vacant, previously accommodating supported living tenants. The rooms were originally constructed as part of the nursing home and were so registered until de-registration a number of years ago to become supported living accommodation. As such, they are adequately sized to meet current DoH care standards for new homes and extensions including en-suite provision.

The works to the five bedrooms are not completed at this stage and the variation application is not approved from an estates perspective.

The findings of this report will provide the provider with the necessary information to assist them to fulfil their responsibilities.

5.0 Inspection outcome

Areas for improvement and details of the Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) were discussed with Marcella McCorkell, registered manager as part of the inspection process. The timescales for completion commence from the date of inspection.

The findings of the inspection were provided to the person in charge at the conclusion of the inspection.

6.0 The inspection

New bedroom accommodation

The five bedrooms are adequately sized to meet current DoH care standards for new homes and extensions including en-suite provision. Redecoration works have been completed in the rooms but a number of areas have been identified for improvement.

Areas for Improvement

The rooms have been extensively redecorated but works have not been completed to the rooms to a level to meet standards required for registration purposes. The following items require completion:

- 1. Window restrictors are required to all windows to maximum opening of 100mm.

 Restrictors should be fitted with robust tamper proof fixings which can only be overridden or removed with the use of a special tool
- 2. The nurse/staff call points should be connected and tested
- 3. Swing-free automatic closing devices which are linked to the home's fire alarm and detection system are required on bedroom doors
- 4. Provision of suitable system of access/egress control is required to the doors leading from the corridor where the five bedrooms are located to the adjacent supported living area of the building. Additionally, consideration should be given to the security of the doors leading from the new bedroom corridor to the outside areas
- 5. Supplementary equipotential earth bonding cables in en-suite to bedroom 5 requires reconnecting
- 6. Consideration should be given to removal of the shower curtains in all en-suites and provision of alternative splash protection
- 7. Mechanical extract fans to en-suites require servicing and cleaning
- 8. Documentation confirming the following items is required:
 - Servicing and calibration of thermostatic mixing valves at all wash hand basins and showers
 - Certification/confirmation that the fixed electrical installation is in a satisfactory condition and has been formally inspected and tested within the past five years
 - Certification/confirmation that the fire alarm and detection system has been serviced within the past six months
 - Certification/confirmation that the emergency lighting installation has been serviced within the past year
 - Confirmation that the fire risk assessment has been reviewed to include the proposed change of use of the five bedrooms from supported living accommodation to nursing beds within the nursing home and that any items highlighted for action have been suitable addressed.

7.0 Quality improvement plan

Areas for improvement identified during this inspection are detailed in the quality improvement plan (QIP). Details of the QIP were discussed with Marcella McCorkell, registered manager, as part of the inspection process. The timescales commence from the date of inspection.

The registered provider/manager should note that if the action outlined in the QIP is not taken to comply with regulations and standards this may lead to further enforcement action including possible prosecution for offences. It is the responsibility of the registered provider to ensure that all areas for improvement identified within the QIP are addressed within the specified timescales.

The registration is not transferable so that in the event of any future application to alter, extend or to sell the premises RQIA would apply standards current at the time of that application.
