4.0 Inspection summary

An unannounced inspection took place on 15 June 2018 from 15:55 to 16:30

This inspection was underpinned by:

- The Nursing Homes Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005
- Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety (DHSSPS) Care Standards for Nursing Homes, April 2015

This inspection was focussed specifically on fire safety. The purpose of the inspection was to investigate the validity of information received by the RQIA "concerns call desk" on Friday 15 June 2018, from an anonymous caller, RQIA ref C005387.

The caller alleged that the fire evacuation routes were not adequate and that a patient in the home was concerned about this subject.

Upon inspection the allegation was found to have no basis, the fire risk assessment was completed by an accredited fire risk assessor, was currently valid, with the fire risk listed as tolerable. A physical inspection of fire means of escape routes was completed during the inspection and no issues were noted.

The following area was reviewed during the inspection:

• Fire safety

6.0 The inspection

Fire Safety:

The NIHTM84 fire risk assessment was valid, completed on 22 June 2017; fire risk was evaluated as tolerable by the risk assessor who holds relevant accreditation for fire risk assessment.

Fire drill records were reviewed; last fire drill completed 15 March 2018.

All ground floor final exit doorways were visually inspected to ensure functionality; no issues noted.

Escape stairways visually inspected; no issues noted.

Weekly building user fire detection & alarm test record reviewed; last test date recorded 11 June 2018

There were no issues for improvement identified during the inspection.

7.0 Quality improvement plan

There were no areas for improvement identified during this inspection, and a QIP is not required or included, as part of this inspection report.





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
