#### 4.0 Inspection summary

An announced inspection took place on 11 December 2018 from 11.40 to 13.30.

This inspection was underpinned by:

- The Nursing Homes Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005
- Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety (DHSSPS) Care Standards for Nursing Homes, April 2015

The purpose of the inspection was to evaluate proposals related to the variation application ref VA011072.

The proposals included the following:

- Provide an en-suite WC facility in first floor bedroom 36 (bedroom plan size greater than 12 sq m after conversion works completion).
- Convert a former first floor store-room into a quiet room.
- Convert the former first floor office into bedroom 27.

It is proposed that the number of registered patients will increase buy one, from 35 to 36, upon completion of the variation process.

The following areas were examined during the inspection:

- legionella risk assessment and associated control measures records
- fire risk assessment and associated control measures records
- gas safety certificates
- health& safety controls monitoring records
- accommodation to be altered in the variation works

#### 5.0 Inspection outcome

Areas for improvement and details of the Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) were discussed with Paul McGranaghan, Proprietor, as part of the inspection process. The timescales for completion commence from the date of inspection.

The variation proposal to complete the following alterations was agreed in principle, subject to compliance with the care standards:

- convert the former first floor office into a bedroom;
- incorporate an ensuite WC into first floor bedroom 36;
- convert first floor store room into a `quiet room`

The findings of the inspection were provided to the person in charge at the conclusion of the inspection.

#### 6.0 The inspection

#### Findings

#### Health & safety

Maintenance service records were provided for the kitchen gas cooker appliance, however no currently valid Gas Safe Register engineer report was available to verify that the appliance was currently safe to use. (gas safety certificate received by e-mail 18 December 2018). Gas safe Register certificates were presented for the space heating and laundry gas appliances.

#### Accommodation

Accommodation designated for conversion works was reviewed. Floor, wall, ceiling finishes and interior fabrics will be replaced to comply with care standards. Patient-call activation points will be provided.

#### Fire safety

The currently valid fire risk assessment was completed on 10 September 2018, the risk was evaluated as `tolerable`. Prior to commencement of building works the HTM84 Fire Risk Assessment must be reviewed and any necessary precautions implemented to provide a safe environment for patients or their visitors. Site specific temporary control measures should be completed during the construction phase of the proposed project. A swing free automatic door hold open device is to be installed on the new bedroom door.

#### Areas for improvement

Gas Safe Register engineer verification that the kitchen gas cooker is safe to use must be provided by the registered manager (verification received by e-mail 18/12/18). Floor, wall & ceiling finishes plus interior fabrics must be replaced in bedrooms designated in

this variation proposal.

The fire risk assessment must be reviewed, and any necessary control measures implemented.

#### 7.0 Quality improvement plan

Areas for improvement identified during this inspection are detailed in the quality improvement plan (QIP). Details of the QIP were discussed with Paul McGranaghan, Proprietor, as part of the inspection process. The timescales commence from the date of inspection.

The registered provider/manager should note that if the action outlined in the QIP is not taken to comply with regulations and standards this may lead to further enforcement action including possible prosecution for offences.
