

## 4.0 Inspection summary

An announced inspection took place on 22 May 2018 from 10:30 to 12:45. Gemma McDermott, Estate Support Officer also attended the inspection.

This inspection was underpinned by

- The Nursing Homes Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005
- Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety (DHSSPS) Care Standards for Nursing Homes, April 2015

The purpose of the inspection was to review and investigate information submitted by the RQIA care inspector following an inspection on 9 April 2018, (reference: IN030879). The care inspector requested an estate inspector review of the condition of the interior building fabric and finishes.

The following areas were examined during the inspection:

- Fire safety risk assessment
- Legionella risk assessment
- Maintenance inspection certificates for the building services
- Condition of building interior fabric & finishes

The findings of this report will provide the provider with the necessary information to assist them to fulfil their responsibilities.

Areas for improvement and details of the Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) were discussed with Wayne Salvatierra, Manager, as part of the inspection process. The timescales for completion commence from the date of inspection.

The findings of the inspection were provided to the person in charge at the conclusion of the inspection.

### 6.0 The inspection

#### **Building Services**

1. There was no valid thermostatic mixing valve (TMV) maintenance verification certificate presented to confirm periodic planned maintenance had been completed.

#### Health & safety

- 2. Bedroom 9 wardrobe was not securely fixed to the structural wall or floor (the manager agreed to rectify immediately following the inspection).
- 3. Bedroom 41 the television aerial cable was not securely fixed to wall or floor surfaces, and constituted a trip hazard.

#### **Building fabric & finishes**

4. A number of minor decoration repairs were noted on wall/ceiling surfaces, redecoration repair works are currently ongoing. Generally the interior fabric and finishes were in a satisfactory condition.

#### Areas for improvement

- TMV maintenance works are to be completed, and a verification certificate is to be submitted to RQIA
- Bedroom 41 the television aerial cable must be secured to prevent a trip hazard occurring.

## 7.0 Quality improvement plan
