Unannounced Care Inspection of Hamilton care Home

1. Summary of Inspection

An unannounced follow-up care inspection took place on 31 July 2015 from 11.15 to 12.15 hours.

The inspection sought to assess progress with the issues identified during and since the preregistration inspection undertaken on 18 June 2015 and to determine if the resultant conditions imposed on registration could be removed. As a result of the findings of the inspection and in consultation with senior management in RQIA a decision was made to remove the conditions imposed on the registration of the home to allow the admission of up to 24 patients.

On the day of the inspection, the care in the home was found to be safe, effective and compassionate. There were no areas of concern identified during the inspection. A Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) is not included in this report.

Recommendations made as a result of the last inspection relate to the DHSSPS Care Standards for Nursing Homes, April 2015. Recommendations made prior to April 2015, relate to DHSSPS Nursing Homes Minimum Standards, February 2008. RQIA will continue to monitor any recommendations made under the 2008 Standards until compliance is achieved. Please also refer to sections 5.2 and 6.2 of this report.

For the purposes of this report, the term 'patients' will be used to described those living in Hamilton Nursing Home which provides both nursing and residential care.

1.1 Actions/Enforcement Taken Following the Last Care Inspection

The last care inspection was a pre-registration inspection on 18 June 2015. A number of patients had been moved to an unregistered part of the premises in breach of the Nursing Home Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005 and the Health and Personal Social Services (Quality, Improvement and Regulation) (Northern Ireland) Order 2003.

As a result of the last inspection the following conditions were placed on the registration of the home:-

"The Registered Provider shall cease all further admissions to the home until further notice by RQIA.

The Registered Provider shall, by 26 June 2015, comply with the requirements outlined in the quality improvement plan of the RQIA Preliminary Estates Inspection Report issued following the pre-registration of the inspection of the home on 18 June 2015."

Given the concerns in relation to the serious breach in legislation, the registered provider was invited to a meeting at RQIA on 1 July 2015 to discuss the breach in legislation and the proposed actions in respect of further planned environmental improvements to the home. At this meeting the provider offered an apology for the breach in regulation and actions were agreed with RQIA in respect of the future proposed works.

1.2 Actions/Enforcement Resulting from this Inspection

Enforcement action did not result from this inspection. In discussion with senior management in RQIA it was agreed that the conditions imposed on registration would be removed to allow admission of up to 24 patients.

The inspection sought to assess progress with the issues raised during and since the previous pre-registration inspection on 18 June 2015 and to determine if the resultant

conditions imposed on registration could be removed. Please refer to section 2 for further information on the conditions imposed on registration.

4. Methods/Process

Specific methods/processes used in this inspection include the following:

- · discussion with nurse in charge
- · discussion with registered provider
- · discussion with two general managers
- discussion with patients
- · inspection of the premises
- evaluation and feedback.

The inspector met with five patients and a number of others in groups, one staff nurse, the registered provider and two general managers.

Prior to inspection the following records were analysed:

- the QIP from the previous care inspection
- the registration status of the home
- correspondence received from the providers in response to the previous inspection.

5. The Inspection

5.1 Review of Requirements and Recommendations from the Previous Inspection

The previous inspection of the home was an announced pre-registration inspection conducted by the aligned care inspector and aligned estates inspector on 18 June 2015. A separate report and QIP was issued for the estates inspection. The completed QIPs were returned and approved by the appropriate inspectors.

5.3 Areas Examined

3.1. Environment

The new café area and existing dining room had been completed to a high standard of décor. The fire exit in the café area was now fully operational. A specialised tap for boiling water had been fitted to enable patients and relatives to make hot beverages. The registered provider explained that a risk assessment is to be completed for its use. Patients and relatives will need to receive a demonstration on its use as there is an in-built safety mechanism to prevent accidental injury. A "very hot water" warning sign is also to be fitted. The registered provider confirmed that these actions would be taken. Compliance will continue to be monitored as part of ongoing inspection activity.

The floor of the fire exit attached to the link corridor had been made level and permanent stairs fitted. There was still some minor finishing works required to the walls around the old fire door in the link corridor. The general manager explained that the old fire door was to be replaced next week with a new fire door at which point the walls would be repaired.

On the day of inspection there were works underway in one corridor to repair an issue with the under-floor heating which was creating some noise and dust. The registered provider stated that this was to be completed that same day. This was being carried out in anticipation of new flooring which is due to be laid throughout the corridors. A large dividing wall between the nurses' station and the lounge is to be removed which will create a short period of disruption for patients. The registered provider gave assurances that any disruption to patients would be kept to a minimum.

Work to the older wing of the home is due to start next week and will also include the building of a new laundry, storage space and staff area in the basement. The general manager explained that minor modifications had been made to the location of the staircase and revised plans would be submitted to RIQA for review. The registered provider stated that these works should be completed in full by the end of the year.

3.2. Patients' comments

Those patients spoken with were very happy in the home. Patients acknowledged that the building works were sometimes noisy but stated that they were not unduly disturbed. They were of the opinion that the home had been improved as a result of the works. One patient in particular was delighted with their new room.

3.3. Conditions of Registration

The following conditions were imposed on the registration of Hamilton Care Home following a pre-registration inspect ion on 18 June 2015:

"The Registered Provider shall cease all further admissions to the home until further notice by RQIA.

The Registered Provider shall, by 26 June 2015, comply with the requirements outlined in the quality improvement plan of the RQIA Preliminary Estates Inspection Report issued following the pre-registration of the inspection of the home on 18 June 2015."

The registered provider had fully complied with the conditions as stated above. It was noted that whilst there were still some outstanding works the majority of these had been completed and the home was generally presented to a high standard. The works were being carefully managed to minimise the impact on the patients. The manager confirmed that they had received recent enquiries regarding admission to the home and they had one vacancy at present. The registered provider stated that prospective patients and their families had been made aware that building works were ongoing at present.

Following the inspection and subsequent discussion with senior management in RQIA, it was agreed to remove the conditions to allow the admission of up to 24 patients. This was confirmed in an email to the registered provider sent on 3 August 2015 and formal correspondence is to be forwarded to the registered provider accompanied by the amended registration certificate.

There are currently three bedrooms being used for storage until the new basement storage area is completed. The registered provider enquired as to the possibility of further admissions to the home if the new storage space was built and the bedrooms became available. This was discussed and it was agreed that no patients should be admitted over the 24 "maximum number of approved places" as stated on the certificate of registration. Should the registered provider wish to admit any patients over and above this number, RQIA must be notified and a decision made regarding any further variations to the conditions of registration.

6. No requirements or recommendations resulted from this inspection.
