4.0 Inspection summary

An unannounced inspection took place on 11 December 2019 from 13:15 to 14:30.

This inspection was underpinned by:

- The Nursing Homes Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005
- Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety (DHSSPS) Care Standards for Nursing Homes, April 2015

The purpose of the inspection was to follow up on building services issues related to variation application ref VA011178.

The variation application proposed to:

- Convert existing office accommodation located to the rear of the site into a `Therapeutic Room`.
- Create new Office accommodation by the installation of a prefabricated `Portacabin` within the rear yard/ garden area.
- Create an additional activity/day room by the installing of a prefabricated timber hut in the rear garden; the `hut` is to be utilised solely by one named service user/patient.

The following areas were examined during the inspection:

The new accommodation: (1) Therapeutic room, (2) `Portacabin` administration office & (3) Timber garden hut.

- Fire safety controls;
- Legionella prevention controls;
- Building services inspection certificates

The findings of this report will provide the registered person with the necessary information to assist them to fulfil their responsibilities.
