4.0 Inspection summary

An unannounced inspection took place on 24 September 2019 from 16.00 to 16.10 hours.

This inspection was underpinned by The Health and Personal Social Services (Quality, Improvement and Regulation) (Northern Ireland) Order 2003, The Nursing Homes Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005 and the DHSSPS Care Standards for Nursing Homes 2015.

The registered persons of Lough Neagh Nursing Home voluntarily ceased to operate the nursing home on 8 May 2018 and all patients were re-accommodated. The registered persons have yet to submit an application to cancel their registration and as such, are subject to a minimum of two RQIA inspections per year. A condition remains on the home's registration to ensure that patients are not admitted to Lough Neagh without prior inspection of the nursing home by RQIA.

This care inspection was conducted to ensure that patients were not accommodated in the home.

6.1 Review of areas for improvement from previous care inspection dated 8 March 2019

There were no areas for improvement identified as a result of the last care inspection.

6.2 Inspection findings

A review of the premises found the building to be unoccupied. The car park was empty and the main doors to the premises were locked. All windows leading to the home were closed. No persons were visually present within the home and bedrooms viewed from the exterior of the home were uninhabited.
