<p>The Regulation and Quality Improvement Authority gives notice of a proposal to cancel the registration of Mr J McCrystal and Mrs A McCrystal, as registered persons of Drapersfield House.</p> <p>The relevant parts of the Order and Regulations are as follows:</p> <p>The Health and Personal Social Services (Quality, Improvement and Regulation) (Northern Ireland) Order 2003</p> <p>Article 15 (1) The Regulation and Improvement Authority may at any time cancel the registration of a person in respect of an establishment or agency –</p> <p>(c) on the ground that the establishment or agency is being, or has at any time been, carried on otherwise than in accordance with the relevant requirements;</p> <p>(d) on any ground specified by regulations.</p> <p>and;</p> <p>The Nursing Homes Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005</p> <p>Regulation 7 (4) A person shall not carry on a nursing home if –</p> <p>(a) he has been adjudged bankrupt or sequestration of his estate has been awarded and (in either case) he has not been discharged and the bankruptcy order has not been annulled or rescinded;</p>	
<p>The reasons for serving this notice of proposal are:</p> <p>On 4 March 2016, RQIA was informed by the Insolvency Service that Mr J McCrystal and Mrs A McCrystal, Registered Persons of Drapersfield House, had been adjudged bankrupt on 2 March 2016. This was confirmed by you both during a meeting at the offices of RQIA on 10 March 2016.</p> <p>RQIA has considered the implications of a registered person being adjudged bankrupt. As outlined in the 2003 Order and associated regulations, a registered person who has been adjudged bankrupt shall not carry on an establishment.</p>	

Under Article 19 of the 2003 Order, the registered person may, within 28 days of the service of this notice, make written representations to the Chief Executive of RQIA concerning any matter which that person wishes to dispute.
