The Regulation and Quality Improvement Authority gives notice of a proposal to impose the following condition to the registration of Gransha Dental: Undertakings placed by the General Dental Council on the registration of Ms Louise McGuigan on 31 March 2025 must be adhered to.	
The reasons for serving this Notice of Proposal are: RQIA received information that on 31 March 2025, Case Examiners of the General Dental Council (GDC) imposed Undertakings on the professional registration of Ms Louise McGuigan, responsible individual for Gransha Dental for a period of 18 months. Following this, Ms McGuigan was invited to attend a meeting at the offices of RQIA on 18 July 2025. The purpose of the meeting was to advise Ms McGuigan of RQIA's intention to issue a Notice of Proposal to impose a condition on the registration of Gransha Dental to reflect the Undertakings placed on Ms McGuigan's GDC registration. Prior to the meeting, RQIA were informed by Ms McGuigan that she would not be attending and was agreeable to the condition being placed on the registration of Gransha Dental. The meeting was convened in the absence of Ms McGuigan. The outcome of the meeting was RQIA's decision to serve a Notice of Proposal in order to place a condition on the registration of Gransha Dental.	

Under Article 19 of the 2003 Order, the Registered Person may, within 28 days of the service of this notice, make written representations to the Chief Executive of RQIA concerning any matter which that person wishes to dispute.
